It is designed to be in alignment with local, county, and state strategic priorities funded by taxpayers, including the Talent 2.0 Child Care Taskforce, Larimer County Behavioral Health Services 0.25% sales tax, and Colorado's Proposition EE (universal Pre-K). By integrating both primary prevention and multi-generational approaches.
